REFERENCE: MISSING AIF SOLDIERS FROM THE SECOND BATTLE OF KRITHIA

Attached please find the result of our investigation which suggests that there is a mass grave containing at least 143 soldiers from the 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Battalions which took part in the Second Battle of Krithia in May 1915 at Gallipoli.

It is believed that the AIF soldiers remain where they were buried in May 1915. This report is submitted for attention and evaluation. The assessment and full accounting of the "missing" of Krithia are respectfully requested in accordance with the Australian Defence Force guidelines.

“MISSING OF KRITHIA”

PROPOSAL FOR THE RECOVERY OF AIF MEMBERS WHO ARE BELIEVED TO BE BURIED IN A MASS GRAVE AT ALCITEPE [KRITHIA] AT GALLIPOLI, TURKEY

BACKGROUND

The Proposers

This proposal is joint work of three Melbourne based WWI enthusiasts; John Basarin, Lambis Englezos and David Howell. Below a brief bio of each contributor is provided.

John Basarin

John BASARIN was born in Istanbul, Turkey. He trained as a chemical engineer and migrated to Australia in 1973. After working world wide, many years in the oil & gas, energy and marine industries, he retired in 2002. John combined his passion for travel and history by leading tours to Gallipoli & Turkey in his retirement.

With his wife, Hatice, he has co-authored six books; "**A Turkish View of Gallipoli**, Melbourne, 1985", "**The Turks in Australia**, Melbourne, 1993", "**Gallipoli – The Turkish Story**, Sydney, 2003", "**Gelibolu 1915**, Istanbul, 2005", "**Beneath the Dardanelles; The Australian submarine at Gallipoli**, Sydney, 2008" and recently "**Canakkale Bogazinin Derinliklerinde**, Istanbul, 2009".

In 2005, John received Victorian Premier's Award for Excellence in Multicultural Affairs for his long-time work on presenting the Turkish side of the tragic campaign at Gallipoli.

John recently completed a PhD degree with Deakin University furthering his understanding of matters related to the Gallipoli campaign and its role in the Australian and Turkish communities today and in the future. The title of his thesis is "**Battlefield Tourism- Anzac Day Commemorations at Gallipoli: An Empirical Analysis.**"

A Rotarian with Hampton Rotary Club, John has given many talks at Rotary Clubs across the country, RSL Clubs, The Shrine of Remembrance, schools and historical societies, presenting the Turkish side of the tragic Gallipoli campaign. John has also written many articles, conference papers and appeared on TV features on Gallipoli and took part in radio programs, both in Australia and Turkey.

The ANZAC Peace Prize, announced annually, is awarded by the RSL to 'recognise any outstanding effort by an Australian citizen who has promoted the concept of international understanding and who, in so doing, has made a contribution to world peace.' The RSL ANZAC Awards Committee has awarded the 2010 ANZAC Peace Prize to John Basarin of Victoria in recognition of his sustained and enthusiastic commitment to promote relationships between Australia and other communities around the world, particularly in Turkey, with a significant emphasis on his commitment to Rotary Youth Exchange programs and building understanding of the Gallipoli Campaign.

Lambis Englezos

Lambis Englezos is a Greek born, recently retired, Arts & Crafts teacher from Melbourne, with a love of lawn bowls and a “magnificent obsession” to find, recover, and honour Australia’s missing Diggers from the Battle of Fromelles. A remarkable and colourful figure, he has become widely known as one of Australia’s foremost experts on Australia’s Great War experience. After meeting many returned Diggers as a child growing up in Melbourne, and adopting them as his “honorary Grandfathers”, Lambis became fascinated in learning about the Diggers of the First World War.

Lambis is the co-founder and driving force behind the internationally renowned “Friends of the 15th Brigade”. He is acknowledged in many books including Les Carlyon’s “The Great War”, Robin Corfield’s “Don’t Forget me Cobber” and was responsible for the publishing of his Digger friend, Roy Kyle’s memoirs which as “An ANZAC’s Story”, and edited by Bryce Courtenay, reached the best seller list in 2004.

In 1996, Lambis developed a theory that up to 200 Australian Diggers, killed at the Battle of Fromelles were still lying in unmarked mass-burial-pits at a wood on the outskirts of Fromelles, France since being buried there by the victorious Germans in July 1916. Lambis then set out to prove his theory with a view to seeing the Diggers recovered and honoured properly. He was met by a wall of discouragement, disbelief, and official contempt. But he persisted.....and gradually an unlikely alliance of supporters, media, and amateur historians gathered around him. In 2008 Lambis and his team were finally vindicated when the mass burial of WW1 Western Front was confirmed, right where the team of “Amateurs” had said it would be.

Lambis is a central figure in Patrick Lindsay’s latest edition of the book “Fromelles” and acknowledged in the book “Fromelles- Don’t Forget Me Cobber” for his contribution to the remembrance of this significant event in Australian History. He has been featured in television articles on “60 Minutes”, and ABC “7:30 Report” on the fate of the missing Diggers.

Lambis received the Order of Australia medal in 2010 for his Fromelles work.

David Howell

David Howell, the founder of Kokoda Historical, is a keen historian and spends most of his spare time researching Australian Military History. In particular David specialises in the South West Pacific Area of Operations and is currently working on several research projects. David spent 5 years as a volunteer guide with the Friends of Kokoda at the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway in Concord, including two years as Vice-President of the Friends, David has taken thousands of people around the memorial educating visitors.

David continued his volunteer work as a guide at the Shrine of Remembrance in Melbourne. before taking up a full time appointment at the Shrine,. He is now the editor of the Shrine's new history magazine Remembrance and looks after public fundraising.

David is well spoken in Tok Pisin the Pidjin language of PNG and is also a current serving member of the Army Reserve. In 2008 David served with the Australian Army peacekeeping in the Solomon Islands.

The Battle of Krithia – 6 to 8 May 1915

At the tip of the Gallipoli Peninsula, the British and French combined forces tried to capture the village of Krithia, without any success, from the start of the campaign on 25 April 1915, in successive efforts over a period of several months.

The 2nd Krithia Battles took place between 6 to 8th of May 1915 with the inclusion of Australian 2nd Brigade commanded by Colonel McKay which was transported from Anzac sector for this purpose. The 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Battalions were involved in the major Allied offensive towards Krithia [Alcotepe] on 8th of May, which ended up in being one of the untold tragedies of the war. The Brigade's casualties ran to about 1000. Turks proved themselves worthy under heavy attack and defended their trenches well.

The last day, 8th of May, saw the fiercest fighting and as Bean (1938) noted "... I never saw so many determined faces at once. Then they threw themselves, heads bent, as if into a thunder-storm, here and there one holding a shovel before his head like an umbrella". AIF front was, on the left Western flank, from Kirte Deresi [Krithia creek] to the Wigan Road [the road to Krithia] on the Eastern or right flank. The Turkish map shows the details of the movements [Figure 1]. The attack began at 5.30 pm and by 6 pm, the charge had stalled against a strong Turkish defensive rifle and accurate artillery fire.

The hundreds of dead and injured lay in no-man's land until the night fall. The no-man's land taken from a photo at the time is shown in Figure 2 with the same terrain shown today in Figure 3.

On the 9th of May, Lt Colonel Bolton [Commander of the 8th Battalion] was visited by the Major Setchly, a staff officer from the Composite HQ Division. Bolton expressed concern of the demoralised and disorganised state of his brigade and requested immediate relief. The 2nd Brigade had reduced to 720 men in the firing line, 450 men in support role and 200 men employed in carrying parties.

Burials on the night of 8th, 9th and 10th of May

C.E.W. Bean reflects on the tragic aftermath in his diary "The cries of the wounded were heart rendering...".

The night's activities were also recorded by Captain Percy Lay who was at Krithia. Captain Lay, in his memoirs, mentioned that a burial party had buried 57 men in one grave during the night of 8th of May, behind the lines.

Private Herbert Lloyd of 5th Battalion also wrote to his sister in Sorrento, Victoria, about mass burials:

"By morning we were fairly safe, as we had a bit of cover. You could count 39 of our boys dead the back of the trench, just in the space we could see. A burial party went out and buried 86 in one grave. I am quite satisfied that I had an unseen guardian over me that day".
(Austin, R. *The White Gurkhas*, 1989, p.118)

The killed and wounded were carried behind the trenches, for the next few nights. Captain Percy Lay mentions digging a traverse trench to carry the dead and the wounded after the battle. The

observations of Percy Lay are relevant as stated below (*The War Diaries of Captain Percy Lay- 1914-1919*: Transcribed and Edited by J Turner)

MAY 8, 1915 "...The cries of the wounded and dying was something awful that night and hundreds must have died from exposure alone. "

MAY 9, 1915 "Had to lie pretty doggo all day and that night we tried to bury some of our dead. A party of us put 57 in one grave and next morning you could not see where we had taken them from. But we also had to hunt through our dead mate's haversacks for rations as it was impossible to get anything up to us."

MAY 10, 1915 "Spent the day digging communication trenches and the same night we got rations brought up. The French opened up a heavy bombardment of the enemy trenches on our own front. Also buried a lot more of our dead."

The clue to the location of burials in mass graves comes from Captain E. Gutteridge, the Regimental Medical Officer (RMO) of 7th Battalion, describing the conditions following the battle as follows:

*"It was the most awful night [8th of May-ed.]. I finally established an RAP (Regimental Aid Post) in a little depression to the right of the creek, three hundred yards behind the lines and the bearers brought the cases in numbers. It was impossible to use a light, every now and then a storm of machine fire would over the plateau and cause us to lie flat. There was no chance of evacuating the cases, the iodine bottle got lost and my morphia ran out." (Austin, R. *The White Gurkhas*, 1989, p.120).*

The recovery and burials continued for a few more days until the brigade was relieved by Lancashire Fusiliers on 12th of May.

Bean's 1919 Account

Bean, with a delegation, went to Gallipoli in 1919 to closely investigate the battlefields and find out several unknowns to Australians. In his memoirs, published in 1948, Bean does not mention the mass graves, although he visits Helles, walks the Krithia 8th of May battlefield and makes the following remarks of his observations;

"The rest of us, searching in an extended line forward of the Tommies' Trench, found the remains of Australians everywhere on the plain, as far forward as the two trenches of the Redoubt Line, 400 and 500 yards ahead respectively. We found Australian kit, and the arm patches of the 6th Battalion, red and purple, and the bronze "Australia" from the shoulder strap, right up to the front Redoubt Line. Two communication trenches had since been dug from the Tommies' Trench right up to the final British front line; and between them, just behind the Redoubt Support Line, was a small detached pit which I recognised as the one in which I found M'Cay and his signaller. We noted down for Hughes [Lt. Cyril Hughes-ed.], Australian graves near the Tommies' Trench. Everything that we planned to do at Helles had now been finished except to survey the battlefield from that goal of so many hopes, the top of Achi Baba." (Bean, 1948, pp.283-308)

Bean concludes his report with comments and recommendations regarding the proposed Helles cemeteries at Gallipoli;

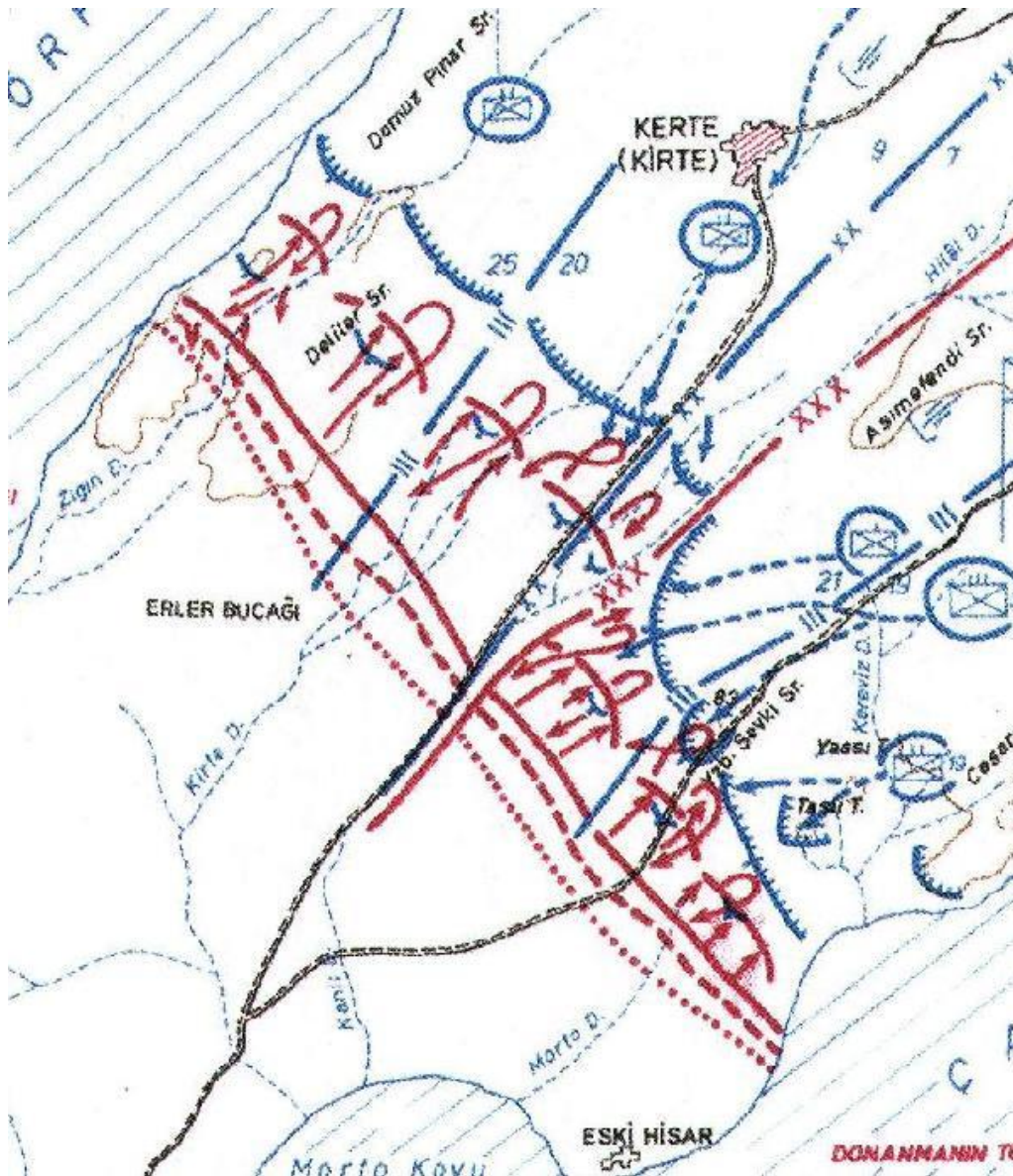
“At Helles the case is different, because the Helles area is larger and more agricultural. There it clearly rests with the British Government whether to express a wish to retain the whole battlefield. The Australian advance (there) on May 8th covered about 1000 yards square. Possibly 200 Australians are buried all over the area, especially (1) just behind the Tommies’ Trench, and (2) behind the support trench dug by the Australians after the advance. Hughes has not yet completed this area, but will certainly identify many graves near these points besides others in British cemeteries. At Helles, therefore, even if the British decide to concentrate the bodies into the main cemeteries, two small Australian cemeteries might be placed at the Tommies’ Trench and the line reached by the Australians. If there is only one cemetery, the Australians should be transferred to a special portion. The graves in Helles should be treated in conformity with whatever principle is adopted by the British.” (Bean, 1948, pp. 381-386)

There seems to be virtually no post-war grave recovery documentation for Krithia from the Graves Recovery Unit, regarding identifying previous places of burial. There are 1387 unknowns at Redoubt cemetery, most of whose nationality was not identified. It is not known whether Lt. Hughes has recovered the Australian soldiers buried in mass graves mentioned by Lay and Lloyd. However this seems unlikely as there are (according to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission records-see Attachment 2), only 5 unknown Australians buried at the Redoubt cemetery.

List of the KIA

The list of killed in action on 8th of May 1915 is shown in Attachment 1, consolidated from the Office of War Graves Commission’s web site. The list shows the following:

- There are 239 KIA from 2nd Brigade, 220 of these being Australian and 19 being British.
- Of the 239; 33 are from the 8th Battalion, 62 from the 7th Battalion, 110 are from the 6th Battalion and 30 are from the 5th Battalion.
- Out of the 220, there are 204 AIF’s Australian members who are listed at the Helles Memorial, indicating that they have no known graves.

ON LOCATION INVESTIGATION & FINDINGS

On 30th of July 2011, John and Hatice Basarin walked the battlefield south of today's Alcitepe Village [Krithia] near the Redoubt Cemetery. During this investigation, the following were discovered:

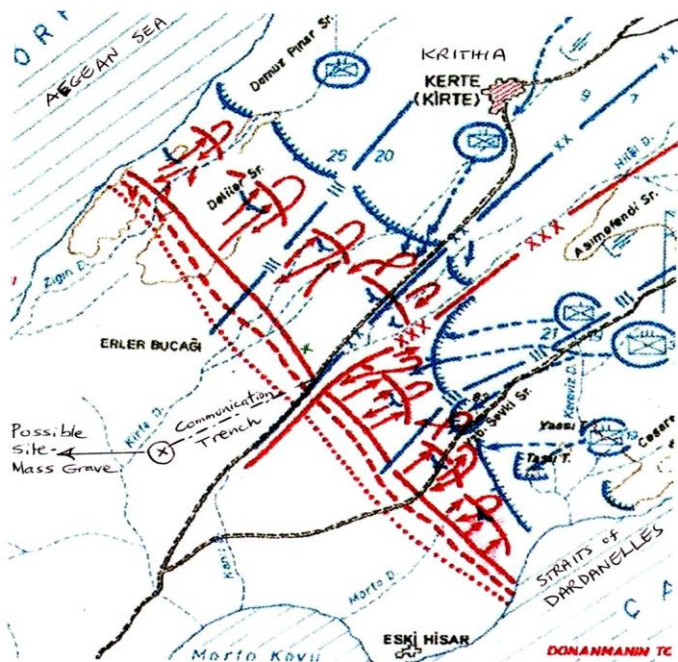
Redoubt Cemetery: This cemetery is located where the Krithia battles took place. It is located, 2.3 km from the village of Alcitepe [old Krithia]. It is maintained by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. The asphalt road from Alcitepe leading to Helles, passes by the cemetery which is located about 100 metres away from the road in the westerly direction.

There is an information plaque at the entrance to the cemetery which gives the background to the conflict and states that there are 20 Australians known to be buried here and 1282 Australians missing. The British dead are 716, NZ 8 and 1 Indian. There is no Turkish memorial on the other side of the Turkish trenches.

The potential grave site: About 150 meters from the end of the communication trench, there is a big dip in the ground. It is about 20 metres in diameter and not far from the Krithia creek. The following photos show the dip from various directions. This location (as shown in Figure 2) is seen as the possible site of the grave of 57 men and 86 men buried in the evening of 8th of May 1915 and 9th of May 1915 as described by Percy Lay and Herbert Lloyd.

The reasons for this conclusion are as follows:

- a. This is the only location in the vicinity of the battlefield that provides a safe location, being out of line of fire which is the point made succinctly by Captain Gutteridge;
- b. The communication trench leads to it – so that the dead and the wounded could be carried to that site;
- c. The location is close to the creek which could provide water required for the large number of dead and the wounded and their carers;
- d. It is approximately 300 yards behind the Allied trenches as mentioned by Capt. Gutteridge.

WHAT IS PROPOSED

It is believed that there is prima facie evidence of the site of mass grave (s) of Australian soldiers involved at the 8th of May 1915 battle of Krithia. These soldiers' names are inscribed at the Helles British Memorial. Hence they can be classified as soldiers with "no known graves". Yet it has been shown here that they might have a known grave, although it is likely to be a mass grave. The possible location of the mass grave (s) is shown in Figure 2, after an investigation of the battlefield on 30 July 2011.

Finally, this documentation is submitted for the proposition that there are unaccounted for Australian "missing" from the battle of Krithia, 8th May, 1915. It is contended that there are unrecovered burial sites

behind the Allied lines. The Graves Recovery Unit records do not indicate any mass grave recoveries post war. It is believed that the mass graves in Krithia described by Captain Percy Lay, 8th Battalion and Pte. Herbert Lloyd, 5th Battalion, remain unrecovered.

This proposal is submitted for attention and evaluation. The assessment and full accounting of the "missing" of Krithia are requested. It is believed that they remain where they were buried in May 1915. It is proposed that the possible grave sites be investigated to find out if there are bodies of the Australian soldiers there. If there are, then they should be given their dignity with a proper burial commensurate with their sacrifice. This would be the least Australia can do to show their respects for the "missing" of Krithia.
