- 3. The Battle of Messines on 7th June 1917.
- 4. The Battle of Hamel.

- 6. The Battle of Amiens (8th August 1918).
- 7. Approximately 3 000 prisoners and 400 guns.
- 8. Monash was knighted at his headquarters at Bertangles Chateau near Amiens on 12th August 1918.
- 9. The five Australian Divisions, once together, were given the title of The Australian Corps.
- 10. 'Mo' and 'Arf a Mo'.
- 11. Monash attended Scotch College (where he was Dux in his final year).
- 12. Charles Bean (Official War Correspondent) and Prime Minister Billy Hughes argued against Monash's appointment.
- 13. Peronne, Mont St Quentin, Capture of the Hindenburg Line, Montbrehain.
- 14. Monash oversaw the repatriation of the troops (most were home by the end of 1919) and the non-military employment schemes, aimed at giving the participants work skills for their return to civilian life.
- 15. 2007 was the ninetieth anniversary of the Battle of Beersheba.
- 16. 31st October (1917).
- 17. The 4th and 12th Light Horse Regiments.
- 18. General Harry Chauvel, who reportedly said, "Send Grant's men straight at it!"
- 19. The 11th Light Horse Regiment.
- 20. Thirty-one Light Horsemen were killed and 36 wounded.

- 1. The intersection was named 'Hellfire Corner'.
- 2. The Menin Road led to Broodseinde, Polygon Wood, Zonnebeke, Westhoek and Hill 60.
- 3. Hooge Crater.
- 4. Private Patrick Bugden, VC, 31st Battalion.
- 5. The Battle of Polygon Wood.
- 6. The Battle for Menin Road commenced on 20th September 1917 and ran into the 21st.
- 7. Polygon Wood was 26th-28th September 1917.
- 8. The Battle of Broodseinde was fought 4th-5th October 1917.
- 9. The First Battle of Passchendaele was on 9th October 1917.
- 10. The Second Battle of Passchendaele was on 12th October 1917. The Canadian forces then continued fighting for the village of Passchendaele between 26th October and 10th November. In this period, Australians suffered casualties from gas attacks and shellfire, despite not participating in the offensives.
- 11. Storm troops were German units specially trained by the Germans to lead attacks (especially in the Spring Offensive of 1918).
- 13. The support trench was the trench immediately behind the front fire trench.
- 14. Tanks were defined as armoured motor-cars propelled by a caterpillar-tractor system.
- 15. Tapes were light-coloured strips of cloth laid on the ground to give alignment or direction to troops moving to or forming for an attack
- 16. Tear-gas shells were filled with a sweet-smelling compound which caused the eyes to water profusely; largely used by the Germans in 1916 for shelling observation posts, etc.
- 17. 'Tel' was Arabic for 'hill' e.g. Tel-el-Kebir.
- 18. 'Tepe; was Turkish for 'hill' e.g. Gaba Tepe.
- 19. Trajectory was the curve described by a projectile while in the air.
- 20. Traverses were buttresses interposed between successive bays of a trench; barriers against enfilading fire.



- 1. Harold Pope; then Eliazar Margolin; Edmund Alfred Drake-Brockman; Ross Harwood; Leslie Edward Tilney.
- 2. (a) Three (b) They were: 3970 Pte Martin O'Meara VC; 3399 L/Cpl Thomas Leslie Axford VC, MM; Lieut. Lawrence Dominic McCarthy VC, CdeG (French).
- 3 .303 inch Maxim Machine Gun.
- 4. Gun itself: 60lb plus tripod: 48lb, plus one ammunition box with filled belt: 21lb, for a total of 129lb.
- 5. The normal rate of fire was 450 rounds per minute (Mark VII .303 ammunition being 500 rounds per minute).
- 6. 1.5 pints of water (around 900ml).
- 7. Six soldiers were required. Their duties were: No.1 was the firer, cleaned and looked after the gun, and carried the tripod into action; No. 2 carried the gun into action, mounted the gun on its tripod, fed the ammunition to the gun and watched for signals; Nos. 3 and 4 were principally ammunition carriers; No. 3 also arranged the spare parts wallet at the gun position, while No. 4 took the ammunition from the limber to No. 3 when a further supply was required; No. 4 also supplied the condensor complete and half-filled with water; No. 3 was additionally responsible for ensuring the condensor reached the gun before the water boiled; the No.4 then placed his rifle and the rifles of other numbers in the limber; No. 5 acted as a scout; No. 6 was the range taker and spare man. 8. Forty five seconds.
- 9 (a). 12.5 seconds (b) Privates O'Brien, Hatcher and McLeod.

 10. Like many other sections, the 16th Machine Gun Section was reorganised in 1916 and absorbed into the 4th Machine Gun Company which served with the four battalions of the 4th Brigade.
- 11. Three-quarters came from Western Australia, the remainder from South Australia.
- 12. "The Bluebirds" after their uniform which was a dark blue shirt and jacket with pale blue piping and a dark blue hat.
- 13. They had to work their passage home as duty nurses, caring for the AIF wives and babies on ships. The same treatment was given nurses who married. Charles Laffin had to find the fare for his wife, Nellie Pike, to come home to Australia. The Bluebirds were also denied their War Gratuity by the Australian Government.
- 14. Lieutenant Harry Moffitt of the 53rd Battalion.
- 15. No; Lieut. Harry Moffitt was KIA during the battle of Fromelles on 19th July 1916 and is believed to be buried in Pheasant Wood.
- 16. The Florence Nightingale Medal. During the war, King was awarded the MM and twice mentioned in dispatches.
- 17. Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service.
- 18. These were transports pressed into service as hospital ships, despite not being equipped to handle medical cases.
- 19. No. 3 General Hospital on Lemnos Island, off the coast of the Dardanelles Peninsula. The hospital equipment did not arrive until three weeks after the hospital was established. The nurses were treating the soldiers on the ground because of the lack of suitable accommodation
- 20. The 21st Battalion was the first AIF Battalion to commence active operation on the Western Front and was the last Battalion to withdraw from active operations on the Western front.

- 1. McKenzie was the Salvation Army chaplain. (He was allocated to the 4th Battalion.)
- 2. McKenzie stood 6'2" and weighed 17 stone.
- 3. McKenzie sailed on the First Australian Contingent on the Euripides, embarking at Sydney on 19/10/14.
- 4. Chaplain McKenzie served on Gallipoli and the Western Front.
- 5. McKenzie's nickname was 'Fighting Mac'.
- 6. The Military Cross, for 'distinguished service in the field'.
- 7. McKenzie was supposed to have been recommended for the Victoria Cross three times. Apart from the MC he was MID.
- 8. The Burial Service at sea (or on land if in port) of those who died on the voyage usually of illnesses such as pneumonia or meningitis.
- 9. The Reverend Andrew Gillison.
- 10. William Dexter DSO MC, who served from 1914 to the end of the War.
- 11. Chaplains involved themselves in organising sports, concerts, fun competitions and games. The timing of the rounds in boxing matches often fell to the chaplains. Censoring the men's letters was a task they were also invited to undertake.
- 12. The Reverend AC Plane.
- 13. Chaplain James Green (Methodist).
- 14. The Reverend John Fahey.
- 15. (a) A **minenwerfer** was a German trench mortar (b) **Mobilisation** is the process by which an armed force passes from a peace to a war footing (c) A **monitor** is a warship of shallow draft and low freeboard intended for use in coastal defence or attack (d) A **mountain gun** was a small cannon constructed for transport, along with its carriage, in several pieces upon pack animals (e) A **Nissen hut** was largely used in camps instead of tents, or for offices; constructed of semi-circular sheets of galvanised iron, which thus form both walls and roof (f) **No-man's land** is the space between the two opposing front trenches or front lines (g) A **Nordenfeldt gun** was an early type of machine gun firing a 1-inch projectile (h) A **nullah** was a gully or dried-up stream bed (i) An **observation post** was a position commanding some desired view of the enemy's position; occupied by observers for artillery, etc (j) An **observer** was one sent out to observe the enemy's line of movements, the fire of guns upon targets, etc.

Answers to DIGGER Quiz No. 28

- 1. Turkey correctly named the 'Turkish Star for the Gallipoli Campaign'. A design was submitted for a Gallipoli Star and Ribbon for British troops, but was eventually withdrawn in favour of the 1914-15 Star.
- 2. The 41st Battalion had no prisoners taken by the enemy. The battalion's Latin motto translated as 'Death Before Shame'.
- 3. In May 1918 the Germans stated in their Army Reports that the troops "most to be feared" and who were the "most courageous" were the Australians, the Guards, and the 5th Highland Division.
- 4. The first gas attack was at Ypres against the Canadian Highlanders, on the left of the British line, and a coloured French regiment on April 22^{nd} 1915.
- 5. The 'Desert March' took place between Tel-el-Kebir and the Suez Canal. The men had to walk in soft sand, carrying heavy and full equipment, 120 rounds of SAA, rations and limited water, thirty-nine miles in three days (24 hours of marching). This horrible march is dramatically and truthfully recounted in many unit histories and soldiers' memoirs, such was the impact of it on the men.
- 6. The death penalty did not apply to the AIF.
- 7. Major CH Brand (3rd Brigade) was the first to win the DSO, for his deeds during the first half-hour ashore at Gallipoli.
- 8. Captain TP McSherry (later Lieutenant Colonel and DSO) of the 15th Battalion was the first to be awarded the MC.
- 9. The 63 VCs went to: 17 privates, one driver, eleven corporals, ten sergeants, eighteen lieutenants, five captains and one major.
- 10. The 63 VCs went to: 57 infantry battalions, one light horse regiment, one AFC squadron, one pioneer battalion and three machine gun battalions.
- 11. (a) An **epaulment** is a side-work (e.g. a mound of earth) to afford cover, usually to a gun position, from flanking fire. (b) An **estaminet** was a French inn. (c) **Explosive bullets** contained an explosive, but these were never used by or against the Australians. 'Expanding' bullets (made, or tampered with, to expand on impact) were sometimes referred to as 'explosive'. (d) **Extended order** was a formation in which men (and often successive lines of men) were separated by wide intervals. (e) A **fantass** was a flat-sided tank used for the carriage of water on a camel's back. (f) A **field ambulance** was the first medical unit behind the regimental medical detachments in the case of infantry, about 250 strong, under a lieutenant-colonel; provided with stretcher bearers, horse ambulances, and tents. (g) A **field company of engineers** was attached to an infantry division for ordinary military work (bridge-building, trench-siting, etc.). Usually about 220 strong, under a major. (h) A **field gun** was a mobile gun used on the battlefield for low-trajectory, high-velocity fire. (i) The **firestep** was a step in a fire trench on which men stood in order to fire over the parapet. (j) The **fire-trench** was a trench from which men fired (as opposed to a communication trench). If properly made, consisted of a series of short fire bays with traverses between them.

- 1. The 28th Battalion was a Western Australian unit, formed at Blackboy Hill Camp in April 1915. 2. The 28th Battalion was part of the 7th Brigade (2nd Division).
- 3. The 28th's colour patch was a 'white over blue' diamond.
- 4. The Nek, or the junction of Rhododendron Spur and Sari Bair. The Apex was nearby.
- 5. From Gallipoli they first went to a valley near Mudros on Lemnos Island, before heading to Tel-el-Kebir, Egypt.
- 6. The reinforcements went to the 51st Battalion, which was formed as the 'daughter' of the 11th Battalion (also WA).
- 7. The 'Nursery Sector' near Armentieres.
- 8. The Old German line between Ovillers-Courcelette Road and the Bapaume Road. Here the battalion received 467 casualties, with all four company commanders killed.
- 9. The 28th was rested in Belgium near Zillebeke and Steenvorde.
- 10. The battalion was at Flers in the dreadful winter of 1916/17. Mud to a depth between three inches and three feet covered the trench floor and oozed from the trench walls. The weather was freezing and caused the Australians great hardship.
- 11. The outpost villages near Bullecourt were Queant and Noreuil.
- 12. The 5th, 6th and 7th Brigades were tasked to capture the villages.
- 13. Many bomb (hand grenade) fights took place as the 28th Battalion and Germans sought to capture or retain the villages.
- 14. The 28th had a supporting role to the attacking battalions and were also a source of reinforcements when more men were needed.
- 15. The 28th Battalion's last action was in the Beaurevoir Line in the first week of October 1918.
- 16. The 36th Battalion was drawn from NSW and was formed at Broadmeadows Camp (Newcastle) in February 1916.
- 17. The 36th was one-quarter of the 9th Brigade, 3rd Division.
- 18. The 36th's colour patch was oval, with 'white over green'.
- 19. The 36th was often referred to as 'Carmichael's Thousand', after the NSW politician, Ambrose Carmichael, who served in the battalion as a captain. Carmichael recruited many of the men from the rifle clubs of NSW.
- 20. The 36th Battalion suffered heavily at Crest Farm.

- 1. The nickname was a pun on 'Maid of Orleans' 'Made of All Leanes'. Brothers Benjamin and Raymond Leane, three nephews and other relations served in the 48th Battalion. Ray Leane was Lieutenant Colonel of the 48th in 1916-1918, rising to lead the 12th Brigade till the Armistice.
- 2. Captain Edward Leane, KIA 23rd May 1917 and Major Benjamin Leane, KIA 10th April 1917.
- 3. The 48th was the daughter of the 16th Battalion (WA/SA). Both would be considered amongst the best fighting units of the AIF.
- 4. Their shoulder patch was round, with white over blue.
- 5. Private James Park Woods won his VC at Le Verguier, northwest of St Quentin, on 18th September 1918.
- 6. Lieutenant George D Mitchell. His book is one of the best add it to your library.
- 7. DCM (when a corporal at Bullecourt, 1917) and the MC (when lieutenant at Albert, 1918).
- 8. Dernancourt this battle is the subject of one of the AWM's dioramas.
- 9. The 48th hung on for another one hour and ten minutes.
- 10. Bullecourt casualties were 15 officers and 421 other ranks (of which 3 officers and 118 men were taken prisoner).
- 11. Pozieres (1916) to Le Verguier (1918).
- 12. The 'RAP' is the post in or close behind the line where the regimental surgeon and details give first treatment to the wounded.
- 13. A revetment is a buttress of wood, sandbags, or other material to hold up a steep side of trenches or open works.
- 14. A grenade or bomb fired from a rifle by special contrivances sometimes by the insertion of a rod into the rifle-barrel; sometimes operated by the firing of an ordinary cartridge.
- 15. Shallow pits dug by soldiers, usually under fire in battle, from which they can fire their rifles; the first stage of a trench.
- 16. A salient is a curve in the line of battle, projecting towards or into the enemy's line. (Examples would be the Ypres Salient and the Sugarloaf Salient at Fromelles.)
- 17. A salvo is a single discharge of the guns of a battery in succession.
- 18. A sangar is a wall of loose stones piled so as to form a small breastwork.
- 19. A work similar to a trench, but dug forward from an existing trench or cavity by men working below the level of the surface.
- 20. The 75-millimetre field gun of the French Army, known for its rapid rate of fire.

- 1. A purple 'T' with the numbers 1, 2 or 3 designating the Company.
- 2. The Australian Electrical and Mechanical Mining and Boring Company.
- 3. The 'Alphabetical Company'.
- 4. 'The Red House', containing German machine gunners and snipers.
- 5. To demolish the house with explosives (46 kilograms were used).
- 6. Sergeant Hugh Frazer and Sapper Morris.
- 7. The first of three Military Crosses that Woodward was awarded during WWI. He was annoyed that Sergeant Hugh Frazer and Sapper George Morris did not receive any decorations in the attack on Red House. Later in the war Hugh Frazer won the DCM for rescuing buried men. He died on 31st May 1918 and is buried in Ebblinghem Military Cemetery. Sapper George Morris survived and returned to Australia after the war ended. (George's brother, Thomas, was featured in *DIGGER* 30, pp55-57. George Morris will be profiled in a future issue.)
- 8. The detonation of the first mine at Hawthorn Redoubt by the British, ten minutes before zero hour on the 1st July 1916.
- 9. The official name was 'Wallangatta Dugouts', but it was commonly called 'The Catacombs'. An entrance was adorned with a cut-out metal kangaroo.
- 10. 3rd October 1916.
- 11. Sorting out the 'Berlin Tunnel', which had been fought over and countermined by the Canadians and Germans.
- 12. 9th November 1916.
- 13. 'Gentlemen, we may not make history tomorrow but we will certainly change the geography.'
- 14. There were 21 mines in total; 19 were fired on the 7th June 1917. The remaining two were outside the battle perimeter and these were not fired.
- 15. At 3.10am on 7th June 1917.

- 1. Pro Patria ('For Country').
- 2. Arthur Blackburn (Pozieres, July 1916); Roy Inwood (Polygon Wood, September 1917); Phillip Davey (Merris, June 1918). Davey's two brothers also served in the 10th Battalion and won MMs.
- 3. Private Phillip Robin (KIA) and Private Arthur Blackburn.
- 4. The band was made up of men from the Brigade's four battalions, hence they were from Queensland, SA, WA and Tasmania. Men from Broken Hill in far-western NSW were also allocated to the brigade.
- 5. The 3rd Brigade comprised the 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th Battalions. (This brigade was given the honour of being the first to land on Gallipoli.)
- 6. Lieutenant Colonel Michael Wilder-Neligan CMG, DSO, DCM.
- 7. The 10th Battalion drew from South Australia and Western NSW (which formed the 4th Military District).
- 8. The 10th made one attack on Celtic Wood.
- 9. The first (of two) attacks on Celtic Wood was made by the 11th and 12th Battalions on 7th October 1917.
- 10. The 10th Battalion raided Celtic Wood two days later, on 9th October 1917.
- 11. The raid was led by Lieutenant Frank J Scott of Gawler, SA.
- 12. The 42 men were not seen again. Conjecture is that the missing men were taken prisoner and then 'disposed of'.
- 13. The preceding artillery barrage on the wood had not been as dense as expected.
- 14. The raid was intended to 'persuade a watchful and wary foe to spread his fire and retain reserves at Broodseinde away from II ANZAC ...' [The Anatomy of a Raid, Tony Spagnoly, 1991]
- 15. The German 448 Infantry Regiment makes no mention of what happened on 9th October 1917 in their history.

The tour organisers then skilfully arranged the travel itinerary so these visits could take place. In this photo, Maurice Campbell is relating the story of his uncle, **Sgt Harold Campbell**, 3rd Battalion, who is buried as an 'unknown soldier' in Aeroplane Cemetery near Ieper. Such commemorations took place on every day of the tour and proved quite emotional, not only for the relative of the deceased but also for the audience who gathered at the graveside to hear the soldier's story of service and sacrifice.



- 1. 'Jacka's Mob' was written by Edgar John Rule.
- 2. 'Jacka's Mob' was first published in 1933.
- 3. Jacka's mob was the 14th Battalion, which formed part of the 4th Brigade (which became part of the 4th Division after Gallipoli).
- 4. The history of the 14th Battalion was written by Newton Wanliss, whose son Harold served in the 14th Battalion and was killed in action on 26th September 1917.
- 5. Around 5 500 men passed through the ranks of the 14th Battalion.
- 6. Rule reached the rank of Temporary Captain and was awarded the MM and MC.
- 7. The 14th Battalion was formed from Victorian enlistments, mostly drawn from Melbourne and suburbs.
- 8. Jacka also received the MC and Bar.
- 9. Jacka won the VC at Courtney's Post, Gallipoli, on 19th May 1915.
- 10. Joseph Bickley, William Howard, Frank Poliness and Stephen De'Araugo played a part in the VC-winning exploit.
- 11. The 14th Battalion was given the nickname the 'Bacon Stealers'.
- 12. Padre Andrew Gillison and Chaplain Frances Rolland.
- 13. Lieutenant Colonel JH Peck CMG, DSO (known affectionately as 'Dear Old Dad').
- 14. Jacka had his problems with Major General Charles Henry Brand CB, CMG, DSO.
- 15. Lieutenant Colonel Charles Dare DSO.

The Aussie who had endured a long succession of sunless days in frigid Belgium, regarded the landscape with keen interest. 'What's all that bright-looking stuff laying about all over the place?' he enquired of a cobber. They both contemplated it with deep curiosity. The light of recognition gradually appeared on the cobber's face. 'I remember it!' he said reminiscently, as of one recalling a circumstance of the vague long ago – 'it's sunlight!'

The Digger was very annoyed with the Tommy MP, who had pinched him for being in Charleroi without a pass, and he decided to say something really nasty. He thought painstakingly for a minute and then relentlessly uttered these cruel words: 'Cripes! If you had any sense you wouldn't be on a job like yours. Why, if the size of your head was in proportion to your brains, half a peanut shell would do you for a panama!'

- 5. Of the 4 842 known to have served in the 19th Bn, Australian-born men totalled 3 492 and overseas-born 1 350.
- 6. The official figures show 37 members of the 19th Battalion were taken prisoner by the enemy.
- 7. (a) The First AIF went out of existence on 1st April 1921. (b) The war finally ended on 31st August 1923, having officially lasted seven years and 21 days.
- 8. Lieutenant Percy Valentine Storkey VC (later Captain). He was born in New Zealand.
- 9. Storkey won the VC at Hangard Wood, southeast of Villers-Bretonneux, on 7th April 1918.
- 10. Private 5934 Arthur Malcolm Stace.

Member Kim Phillips advises that reprints of Australian WWI unit histories produced by the Imperial War Museum (London) can now be ordered at attractive prices from the Australian online book store, www.booktopia.com.au, based in Sydney. Examples given by Kim include: 7th LHR (\$40.95); 2nd LHR (\$32.50); 28th Bn (\$34.40); 24th Bn (\$61.80); 13th Bn (\$34.40) and 11th Bn (\$75.50). These are facsimiles of the original books and represent great value for books that are extremely rare and expensive in the first edition. Kim suggests that you obtain the ISBN for the books from http://www.naval-military-press.com/imperial-war-museum-books/index3.html and search Booktopia's site using that code. Books are ordered in from overseas once you have placed an order. The Editor found many (perhaps all) Australian infantry battalion and light horse regiment histories are available – books that he thought he could never afford, if indeed he could ever find them! Pozieres Memorial – After the recent recapture of Pozieres it was found that our battalion memorial there had been slightly damaged by shell fire, one of the stays to the cross, on which was engraved the word 'Pozieres', having been splintered and knocked off. Sgt Laing MM, who has taken a keen interest in the memorial, visited the old battlefield and brought the damaged portion of the woodwork back to the battalion as a souvenir. He also immediately had the memorial repaired in conformity with its original design, so that, with the exception of a few shrapnel marks on the beam, it is none the worse for the renewal of hostilities on that historic field. The damaged piece of timber is being forwarded to the war memorial as a souvenir.



Notice of John Laffin Memorial Lecture Day 2012

The 2012 John Laffin Memorial Lecture will be held on **Sunday, 24 June, at Bathurst RSL Club**, 114 Rankin Street, Bathurst, NSW 2795 [ph: 02 6333 2999; www.bathurstrsl.com.au.], commencing at 11am. Lunch may be purchased at the club's excellent bistro.

The principal speaker is **Charlotte Descamps** who will give an in-depth presentation on 'Life on the Battlefields 94 years later'. Born in Poperinge, Belgium, in 1958, Charlotte Descamps has lived her entire life (to date) on the battlefields of the Ypres Salient. In 1998, Charlotte started the **Varlet Farm Bed & Breakfast** operation, specialising in hosting guests with an interest in the Great War. Varlet Farm B&B has been listed by tripadvisor.com as one of the 'Top 10 B&B and Inns' in Europe in 2011.

Charlotte became a qualified battlefield guide in 2004 and is a founding member of the Passchendaele Society 1917, a charity organisation that organises commemoration events in the Ypres Salient. This society was a driving force behind the events commemorating the 90th anniversary of the Battle of Passchendaele. Charlotte's role also included carrying out research for the Passchendaele Memorial Museum 1917 at the British National Archives in Kew. She has also:

- guided battlefield tours for the NZ Embassy on Anzac Day from 2004 till 2009
- lectured to groups visiting Varlet Farm from all over the world, including students, army cadets, army officers, bomb disposal squads and amateur and professional historians
- established contact between the Memorial Museum Passchendaele 1917 and the 48th Highlander Regimental Museum in Toronto, and
- represented the community of Zonnebeke at the inauguration of a new WWI memorial in Essex on November 4th, 2011.

In March 2011, Charlotte began her international speaking career at the annual seminar of the Western Front Association – Pacific Coast Branch in Victoria, British Columbia, Canada. Between March and December 2012 she will speak in the USA, Canada, Australia and New Zealand.

It was decided to hold this year's lecture a little earlier than usual so as to allow those members participating in the Gallipoli extension of the 2012 FFFAIF Commemoration Tour a reasonable interval between the Lecture and the 2nd July departure date. Bathurst was chosen as a central venue, not too distant from Sydney and the Central West, where a good number of our members reside. The city was the birthplace of CEW Bean and home of the training depot for the 54th Battalion AIF. Bathurst has many historic buildings and memorials and is home to the Mount Panorama race track. Changes to Roll of Honour for those who died at sea

In preparing Frev's story on the *Kanowna* for publication, checking of the units for those who died at sea (and were subsequently buried at sea) revealed that the AWM's online Roll of Honour showed for most of the deceased that their 'place of death' was France, Egypt or England.

Apparently, this quite deceptive information comes from the past practice of showing 'place of death' as being the country in which the soldier's name appears on a memorial to the missing. So if a Digger died on the voyage home (even if just off the Australian coast), but his name appears on the Villers-Bretonneux Memorial, then his place of death was recorded on the ROH as 'France'.

After contacting Wendy Gadd at the AWM (who was aware of the problem), sending the list of names from Frev's article has seen their places of death changed to reflect reality. The database now shows such entries as: Red Sea; Tasman Sea; Indian Ocean; at sea off South Africa; North Atlantic Ocean; Great Australian Bight and the Gulf of Aden. Thanks, Wendy, for making the changes to the ROH.

The Editor has pondered how history would have been altered if **Victor Reston**, who died one day out from Sydney, had been kept onboard so that he could have been buried on Australian soil. Would that have made Reston, **General Bridges** and the **Unknown Soldier** at the AWM the only three AIF men who died while on active service to be buried in Australia? – Ed.



- 6. Escort consisted of: HMS *Minotaur* (armoured cruiser, 14 600 tons); the Japanese battle cruiser, *Ibuki* (14 600 tons); HMAS *Melbourne* (light cruiser 5 400 tons); HMAS *Sydney* (light cruiser 5 400 tons). The *Minotaur* left the convoy on 8 November and *Melbourne* took her place.
- 7. A3 SS Orvieto of 12 130 tons.
- 8. The *Minotaur* was 5 miles (8km) in advance of the convoy, which followed in three lines abreast; *Sydney* was on the left; *Ibuki* on the right and *Melbourne* five miles astern.
- 9. 1 November 1914.
- 10. Turkey had declared war on the Allies on 31 October 1914 and the War Office wanted the Australians and NZers to help defend the Suez Canal from Turkish attack. Also, it was thought inadvisable to bring the troops from the southern hemisphere to Salisbury Plain in an English winter, with a lack of suitable accommodation.

Strange Coincidence

April 6, 1917, had been a strenuous day in the 34th Casualty Clearing Station on the Poperinghe road. Wounded soldiers had been pouring in all day. A request went around for a volunteer from among the nursing staff for a blood transfusion for a poor fellow lying almost at the door of death.

Feeling that I should get a rest from the horrors around me, I volunteered. A test was taken of my blood, and I was chosen. After the transfusion I had 24 hours rest, and when I resumed my duties I was told by the doctor that the man to whom I had given my blood wished to see me. I made my way to his side, and when I saw his face I promptly fainted across the bed.

He was my own brother, who had been reported 'killed in action' eight months previously. He is alive to-day. – 'Springbok', Perth.






